Thank you to Blackgang Chine who agreed to the visit as they had never been to as school before! It went extremely well. We also had some fabulous days out to writing workshops, storytelling workshops, Dinosaur Isle and a dinosaur fossil hunt on the beach, visits from Cats Protection and the Friendship Group who came in and cooked with our Year 4 children on Wednesday. I hear the food was delicious! Thank you so much to the Friendship Group who gave up their day. Unfortunately the two football matches were postponed last week and as yet I have not been informed when they are being rearranged but as soon as they are, I will let you know.

I completed my three-day First aid course. There are a couple of changes, one being that when a child has a splinter we may remove it with tweezers or a blunt edge. I am also going to send out a letter just to confirm that you are happy that the school gives first aid to your child when necessary.

This week in school Year 3 parents are invited in for lunch all week and we have the half-price Scholastic book fair arriving in school tomorrow and will be open from 2.30pm. There are always some really good deals to be had at our half-price book fair, especially gifts for Christmas and stocking fillers. Tomorrow is also an Open Day for any new families whose child is due to start school next September. Please let friends and family know that we are open tomorrow, however we are open every day for visits to school if tomorrow is not convenient. We also have safeguarding training for staff on Wednesday and Thursday, and a dodge ball competition for ten Key Stage 2 children on Friday.

Next week is our last week on 'Jurassic Island', and don't forget our whole-school celebration day on Wednesday 2nd December for families to share their child's dinosaur writing with their class. We end the week next week with our Christmas Mufti Day on Friday 4th December in return for non-perishable donations for the Christmas Fayre, which takes place on Monday 7th December from 5pm to 8pm. The letter for the Christmas performances will be with you also today. Please remember to make sure we have your current up-to-date email so that you don't miss out on these important letters.

There has been an education announcement regarding concerns on Facebook where children are being contacted by extremists with unusual names or characters, and children are accepting them as 'friends'. This includes children in primary schools. In school, if we hear of any of our children having a Facebook account then we have to report it to Facebook as you have be thirteen and above to have a Facebook page. I do know that social media is brilliant in so many ways. To keep in contact with friends and family around the world is exciting, however there is a dark side to Facebook and it is about educating our children to ensure that they are safe and that what they are posting is appropriate. Nowadays employers Google their employees, check their Facebook pages and if there is inappropriate behaviour or messages they are dismissing their staff - or not employing them in the first place - so it really does matter what people do and write on Facebook and other sites. There is a FREE e-safety workshop tonight for families and the details are on the reverse of this newsletter.

Since the Head Girls and Head Boy elections I have been meeting with the children to talk about what they would like to see happening in school. This has included more scooter and bike racks, which we have ordered, spinner passes for Year 6 which start today, office jobs at lunchtime which also begin today, and the children have also talked about a tuck trolley, buddies in reception and more playtime equipment. It is great that the children are taking on their responsibilities so professionally. I am very impressed and I will keep you updated with the meetings and suggestions from the children.

Global Rock this week will be 'wild things' on Wednesday from 4pm to 5pm and 'toys' on Thursday, after school until 4pm. A text will be sent to you if your child is required. Up until Christmas we will try and keep rehearsals to a couple of days but after Christmas there will be more, and therefore other clubs around the school will be limited so that we can concentrate on Global Rock.

Thank you for the donations for the couple on Love Lane affected by a house fire. We will take the children to deliver the hamper later this week.
