Continuing on the theme of Christmas, this afternoon at 4pm our very youngest team members take to the stage for their retelling of the Nativity. We will open the doors at 3.50pm this evening and all families are welcome to come and watch their children perform. We look forward to seeing you a little bit later.

Tomorrow is Christmas Lunch Day and, as previously mentioned, children are able to wear their Christmas jumpers for the day. Lunch will be in two sittings starting with KS2 and followed by KS1 and Reception afterwards. The chefs in the kitchen have been busy preparing all of the food and the children will look forward to pulling a cracker or two!

We have just completed the Lanesend Christmas Raffle and the winners have been announced live on Facebook. A text message will also go out to families who have won a prize to collect. My thanks again to all the people who donated prizes and to all the family, friends and team members who brought a ticket to raise funds for the school. We are still raising funds to revamp our Library over the coming year. We do have a little Christmas extra as we have some food hampers to be raffled off for just £1 in a 24 hour 'Christmas Cracker' to be collected on Tuesday. To end the Lanesend Christmas season this year, we have our Christmas Adventure on Monday followed by a Christmas morning of activity on Tuesday. Just a reminder school closes at 1pm on Tuesday. The Den will also be closed on this date and will reopen on our return on Tuesday 3rd January 2023.

This afternoon, the children will watch seven speeches, one from each year group. The seven speeches have been chosen by each year group as the one that they feel was the best one to go through to become Lanesend Speech Champion. I have loved seeing the children rehearse their Christmas addresses and the children have been really inspired about what the King's first Christmas Speech on Christmas Day might entail. It is lovely how their skills and confidence grow each year and I am so amazed by their thoughts and reflection from across the year. We will announce the Lanesend Speech Champions later today.

I am also really proud of the children who have made Christmas cards, calendars and sang carols to the community. This really has spread the love of Christmas and shown kindness to others. This is just what Christmas is all about; as well as having time to spend with our friends and family enjoying many moments of joy and happiness. Our children, your children, do this in abundance.

The team have also completed formative and summative assessments and will be sending home Pupil Progress Reports by the end of the term. We have seen some really nice moments of progress this term and we can see that the impact of the interventions and support that we are giving to the children is making a difference. As well as many other lovely learning opportunities from Dance Live to our annual 'Vocabulary Dress Up Day', which this year is a word in many languages.

I am really looking forward to another year at Lanesend Primary and creating learning that will absorb and engage all the children and cement a love of learning for a life time. Tips for the week... use the 'mirror mirror' trick box card to help manage emotions and create confident, mindful decision making.


We have been reading... 'War of the Worlds' by H. G. Wells (abridged version).

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

Millions of new phones, tablets, laptops and games consoles will be nestling under Christmas trees this year. However, even if parents and carers have gone to the trouble of setting up these new devices and enabling the safety features, there are still potential hazards in the apps, games and software that children will want to install and use. Knowing what to look for and discussing those risks with your child may help avoid any nasty surprises this Christmas. Here are our top tips for ensuring that unwrapping this year's presents doesn't unleash any unexpected dangers.

TAKE NOTE OF AGE RATINGS

MONITOR IN-GAME COMMS

Voice chat with friends is part
of the fun of modern gaming –
but danger lurks here too. Many
titles have open chat systems,
meaning that children could speak to
strangers or hear adult language and
verbal abuse when games get
particularly competitive. Using a shared
family area (as opposed to alone in
bedrooms) for online gaming is a good
way to keep an occasional ear on what's
being said.

BE WARY OF GIFTS

Titles like Robiox, Minecraft and
Fortnite have in-game currencies,
which can be earned through
progress in the game – but can also
be bought with real money. A common
scam is for a young player to be
offered currency if they click a link, visit
a certain site or contact another user
directly. Warn your child about such
offers; they should show you if they're

APPS ARE AGE RATED, TOO

LEGAL APPS THAT BREAK THE LAW

There are many apps that are perfectly legal but enable illegal activity – streaming apps which let people watch football matches, say, without paying for Sky or BT Sport. Prosecution for using such apps is rare, but they can lead to risky behaviour like viewing rogue streams on sites teeming with malicious links. Watch for children installing unusual apps with 'TV', 'stream' or 'sport' in the name.

STAY UPDATED

Most games and apps are subject to regular updates, which not only offer new content and features but also provide critical security improvements. Children tend to ignore such updates – usually because they don't understand why they're important, or they simply want to get straight on with gaming. Check your child's devices periodically to make sure these updates are being installed.
