



Pupil Premium Grant 2015/2016

The Pupil Premium Grant was introduced in April 2011 for children eligible for Free School Meals, Looked After Children and children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces.

We are required to report how many children are entitled to the PPG and how we spend the money.

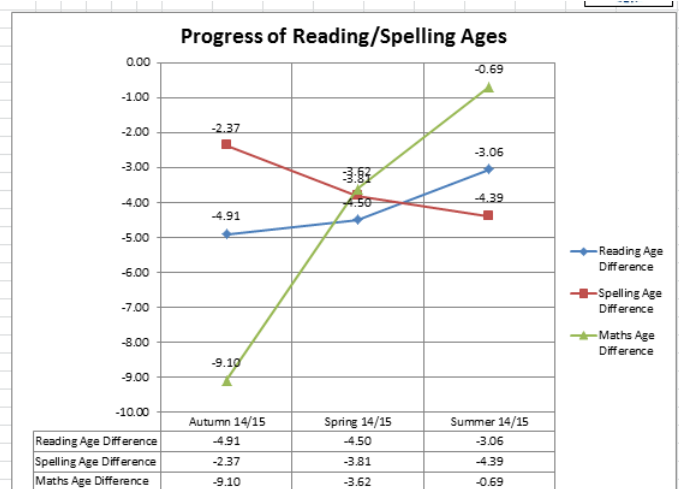
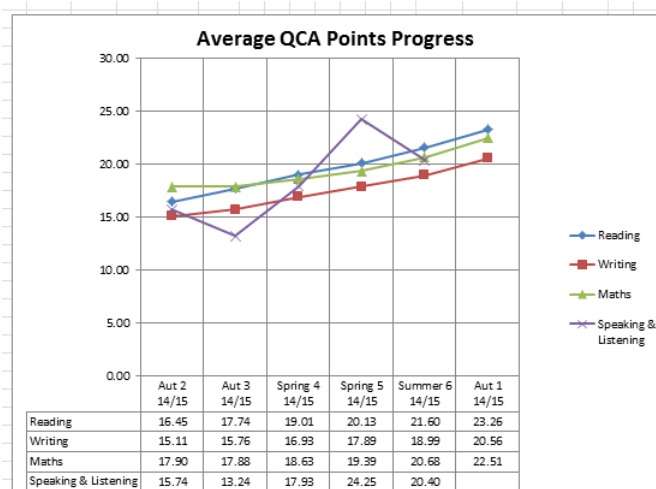
Pupil Premium Grant 2015 – 2016
