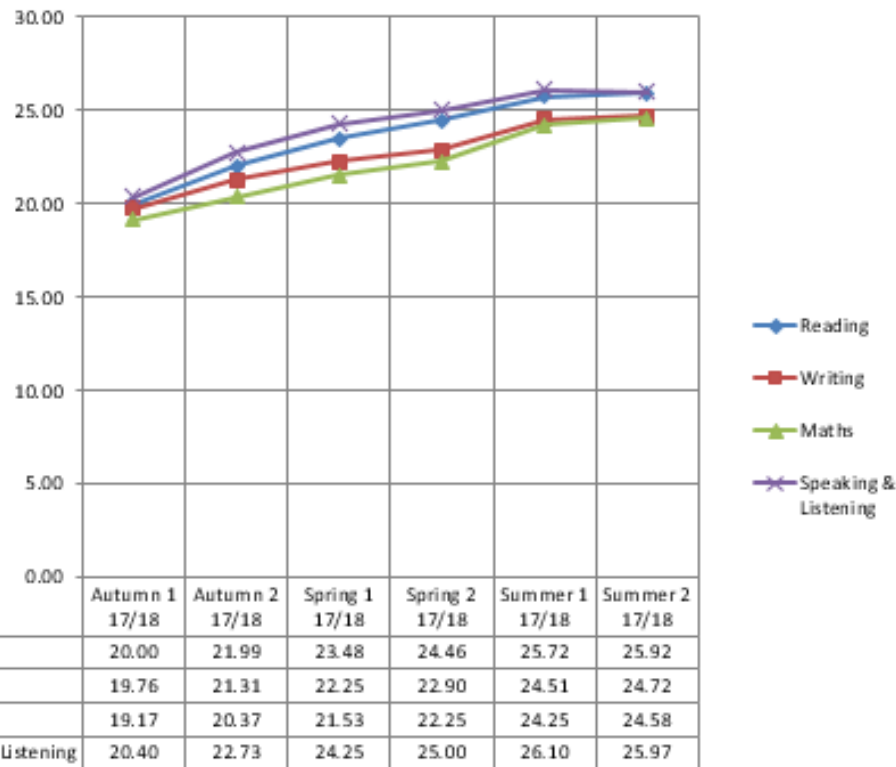
Impact of 2018/2019 pupil premium expenditure

We have monitored the impact of the support provided via our Provision Map which tracks all children within the school, the interventions and support they have had and their outcomes.

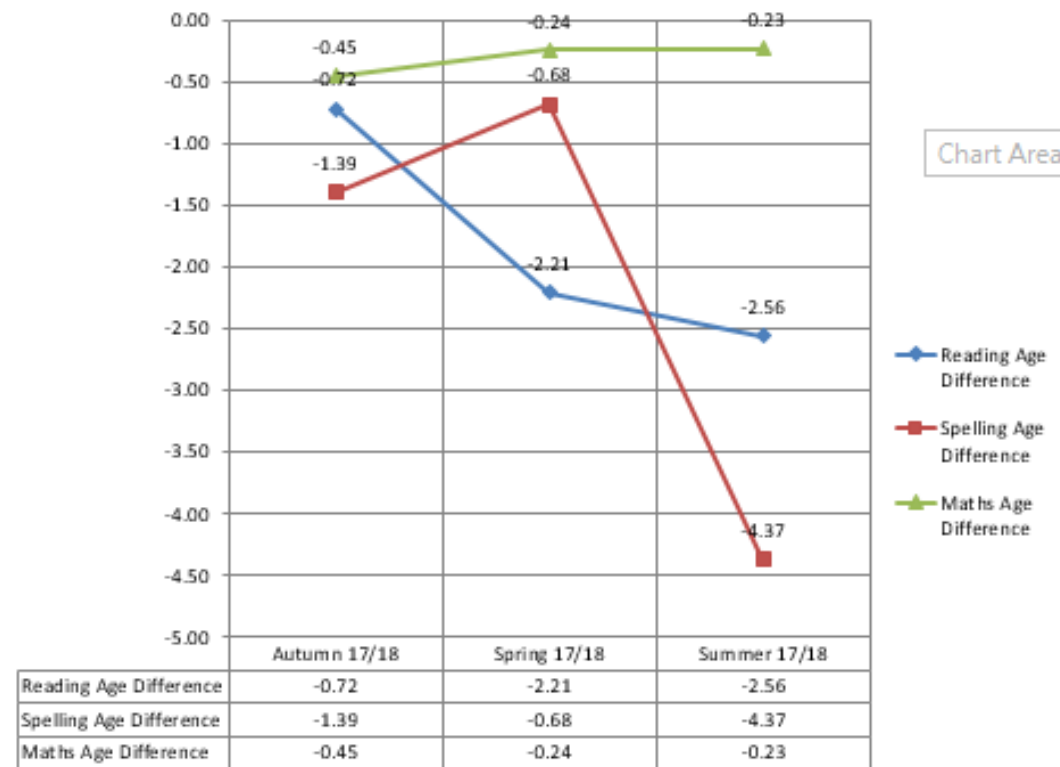
