



Lanesend's tips, hints, shares and likes to help your child develop a love of reading.

"I like lots of books. I like books about dinosaurs best because I like finding out facts about them."

"I like fact books too—especially facts about the world. And I love **Dr Seuss** books—he's my favourite author."

Why is a book better than a tablet?

- They don't need charging.
- They are a lovely way to share a bit of quality time with your child.
- They don't have other distractions—such as games.
- They don't count towards 'screentime' so they are better for your child's developing eyes.
- You can easily tell if they are age appropriate for your child.
- They don't have to include anybody else.
- They are free to borrow from a library, or to

caster—my teacher last year loved her too! I think my teacher now might like a book about Harry Styles."

- "I like non-fiction books best, Books about animals and space."
- "I like books based on films that Ive seen or Search and Find books. I'm reading Charlotte's Web and I realised that my teacher borrowed one of the character's names for our English!"
- "I don't have any books at home."
- "I went to the library once when I was little."
- "I love the Nothing to see here hotel. It is so funny."
- "I love The Creakers, we read it at school in year 3—it was really good.

The 26th Storey Treehouse is my favourite It really makes me laugh."

Why visit the library?

- 1. Joining your local library is free.
- Children change their interests rapidly and are always on the lookout for something new. Going on a weekly trip to the library can you help you out with this—for no money at all!

Changes to Truancy Penalty Notices (TPNs) for non-school attendance The Department for Education (DfE) introduced a new National Framework for Truancy Penalty Notices, taking effect from 19 August 2024. A summary of the changes are detailed below. Per parent, per child TPNs will be issued to each parent, for each child that was absent from school without prior approval by the school For example - three siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving three separate TPNs Five days of term time leave TPNs will be issued for term time leave of five or more days which have not been authorised by the school. 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period TPNs will be considered when there have been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period. The first time a TPN is issued for First period of unauthorised unauthorised absence from school the cost absence exceeding 10 sessions (within a rolling will be £160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days, reduced to £80 per parent if three-year period). paid within 21 days. The second time a TPN is issued for Second period of unauthorised absence from school the unauthorised absence amount will be £160 per parent, per child exceeding 10 sessions (within paid within 28 days. a rolling three-year period) For a third period of unauthorised absence Third period of unauthorised a TPN will not be issued, and the case will be presented to the Magistrates' Court. absence exceeding 10 sessions (within a rolling Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per three-year period) parent, per child. The education welfare service works with families experiencing attendance issues. If you are struggling with your child's attendance (other than holidays) and

need support, please contact the team 01983 823151 or EWS@iow.gov.uk Truancy Penalty Notices (TPN's) explained:- These may be issued if you take your child out of school for unauthorised absenses such as holidays but also consitis of 10 sessions of unauthorised absences for O (unauthorised absence) and U (after registration closes) codes. U codes are used when a child has arrived after registration has closed. 10 U or O codes could result in a TPN being issued. 




